Clause 1 – Purpose of Agreement

This Marriage Agreement (Nikah Contract) is entered into voluntarily by the Groom and the Bride, intending to solemnize their marriage in accordance with Islamic Shariah principles and applicable Canadian law. Both Parties acknowledge their consent and understanding of the terms herein.

Clause 2 – Mahr (Dower)

The Groom agrees to pay the Bride a Mahr amounting to _____ CAD, which is a mandatory gift and consideration in this contract. The Mahr shall be paid as specified herein and is the Bride's exclusive right and property.

Clause 3 – Responsibilities of the Parties

Both Parties agree to fulfill their marital obligations respectfully and faithfully, including mutual support, respect, and cooperation. The Groom undertakes to provide maintenance as required by law and Islamic principles.

Clause 4 – Conditions and Stipulations

Any conditions or stipulations agreed upon by the Parties, including those related to financial arrangements, living conditions, or any other matter, shall be documented and attached as an addendum to this Agreement. Such conditions are valid only if they do not contravene Canadian law or Islamic jurisprudence.

Clause 5 – Custody and Rights of Offspring

The Parties agree to comply with applicable Canadian laws regarding the custody, upbringing, and welfare of any children born of this marriage. Both Parties undertake to act in the best interests of their children at all times.

Clause 6 – Termination and Dissolution

This Agreement contemplates the possibility of dissolution of marriage (Talaq or Khula) as per Islamic law and Canadian legal procedures. Both Parties understand their legal rights and obligations in the event of dissolution.

Clause 7 – Governing Law and Jurisdiction

This Contract shall be governed by and construed in accordance with the laws of Canada and the Province where the Parties reside. Any disputes arising from this Agreement shall be resolved through mediation, arbitration, or the courts of competent jurisdiction.

Clause 8 – Confidentiality

The Parties agree that the terms and contents of this Agreement, as well as any personal information exchanged, shall remain confidential except as required by law or with mutual consent.

Clause 9 – Entire Agreement

This document constitutes the entire Agreement between the Parties with respect to the marriage and supersedes all prior understandings or agreements, oral or written.

Clause 10 – Amendments

Any amendments or modifications to this Agreement shall be valid only if made in writing and signed by both Parties.

Clause 11 – Acknowledgment

The Parties acknowledge that they have read, understood, and willingly accepted all terms and conditions of this Nikah Contract without any coercion, duress, or undue influence.

Clause 12 – Signatures and Execution

This Contract may be executed in multiple counterparts, each of which shall be deemed an original. Electronic signatures shall be deemed valid and binding.
